Durban / COP 17

Green MEPs depart for International Climate talks.

As the <u>COP17</u> United Nations Climate Change Conference, continues its work next week, Green MEPs <u>Satu Hassi</u>, <u>Sandrine</u> <u>Bélier</u> and <u>Bas Eickhout</u> have begun making their way to Durban.

At a <u>press conference</u> in European Parliament in Brussels before their departure, Co-President Rebecca Harms joined the delegation in putting forward the <u>Greens' demands</u> for the Durban climate summit, insisting that the European Union step up its own climate ambitions, so that Europe can lead the world in green technology, and fight for a second commitment period for the Kyoto protocol. The European Parliament has <u>called</u> for the EU to commit to continuing the Kyoto Protocol and it is necessary that European negotiators recognise that developing countries are our allies in these negotiations and show that Europe is on their side.

The <u>concrete demands</u> of the Greens/EFA group for Durban are however insufficient for limiting the increase in global temperatures to safe levels and so must only be the beginning of more ambitious action towards a future <u>international agreement</u>

The opening days have been reported as 'sound' and 'very smooth' and there are <u>slivers of hope</u> for some progress. We will be updating our <u>Stop Climate Change website</u> from Durban and keeping you informed of events on the ground.
